How 2+2 Works

- The 2+2 is a four-year plan that leads to a Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree in Information Systems at WIU. Students will fill out applications for both schools, consult the advisors, faculty and catalogs from both schools for specifics. This completion guide is designed to ensure graduation in four years by taking courses at both Black Hawk College (BHC) and Western Illinois University (WIU). This guide assumes students have met all course prerequisites required by BHC and admission/audition requirements for WIU.
- Upon completion of the first two years of requirements at BHC, students will receive an Associate of Arts (A.A.) degree. Upon completion of the final two years' curriculum requirements, students will receive the B.S. degree with a major in Information Systems.
- A minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.00 should be achieved by the junior year and to graduate from BHC. Students will have to earn a 2.5 Cumulative GPA at WIU to meet College of Business graduation requirements. The B.S. degree is available at the WIU Macomb campus, or Quad Cities Campus; the A.A. degree is available at the BHC Quad Cities or East Campuses or online. **This plan pertains to the Information Systems emphasis offered at both the WIU Macomb and Quad Cities campuses. Students pursuing the Information Systems Cyber Security emphasis at the Macomb campus would choose 24 different hours. See the Macomb campus WIU Information Systems advisor for details.**
- Students following this 2+2 plan will complete a minimum of 120 total credits.

Notes for BHC:

1. Minimum of 60 hours required to complete the Associate of Arts degree.
2. Grades of "C" or better are required for ENG 101 and ENG 102.
3. Completion of one Non-Western studies course is required. Course options are available as an IAI Humanities, Fine Arts, or Social and Behavioral Science course. Consult a BHC Advisor for course options.
4. One science course must be 4 credits minimum to include a lab.

Notes for WIU:

1. Forty-two upper-division hours are required from a 4-year institution.
2. A minimum 60 hours is required from a 4-year institution.
3. A minimum GPA of 2.0 will be required overall, in the major and in the minor(s) (if applicable).
4. Must have 32 s.h. minimum completed in an approved major. At least 15 s.h. of the 32 s.h. of a major must be in courses numbered 300 or above.
5. Students must complete a minor in business which includes: General Business, Accountancy, Business Analytics, Economics, Finance, Human Resource Management, International Business, Management, Marketing, Pre-MBA or Supply Chain Management. Depending upon minor chosen, credit hours taken range from 16 to 24. Some lower division classes may be taken at BHC and completion classes taken at WIU.

2+2 Agreement

Black Hawk College and Western Illinois University agree that if a student completes the Associate of Arts degree and is admitted to Western Illinois University, that student shall be eligible for this Articulation Agreement.

1. This Articulation Agreement is only appropriate for students who transfer from Black Hawk College with an Associate of Arts degree that includes the general education courses that are attached to this document, and who pursue a Bachelor of Science in the following business programs from Western Illinois University: Accounting, Business Analytics, Economics, Finance, Human Resource Management, Management, Marketing, Supply Chain Management and Information Systems. The series of courses that must be taken to complete the baccalaureate degree at WIU are attached to this document.
2. The student must satisfactorily complete the course requirements at Western Illinois University to earn a Bachelor of Science in Accounting, Business Analytics, Economics, Finance, Human Resource Management, Management, Marketing, Supply Chain Management or Information Systems.
3. Students admitted under this 2+2 Agreement must meet all other graduation requirements as listed in the student undergraduate catalog at Western Illinois University.
4. If either Black Hawk or Western Illinois University changes major program requirements, general education requirements, graduation requirements, this agreement is subject to renegotiation.



